Jamaica joins countries in the Region of the Americas, through the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), in celebrating the 22nd Annual Vaccination Week in the Americas (VWA), under the theme, "Engage now to protect your future #GetVax." This is being done in conjunction with the 13th observance of the World Health Organization's World Immunization Week. This vaccination week in the Americas allows the Health Ministry to reflect on the significant role that immunization plays in preserving life, supporting public health, and building a resilient future for all.

In his main address at the launch of the Vaccination Week in the Americas, Mr. Dunstan Bryan, Permanent Secretary, MOHW, emphasized the importance of people taking up the vaccines. He said that the ministry should look at all of the immunizations and antigens along the life course and offer them to not just our children but to all ages, including the elderly. These antigens will help the people of Jamaica to live longer.

During his remarks, the Hon. Alando Terrelonge, Member of Parliament for East Central St. Catherine and State Minister of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade, said that he is proud of the strides being made in the public health care system. He added that his role at the launch is not just as one who legislates but as one who actively advocates to ensure that members of the community understand the importance of vaccination, similar to what was done during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Ministry of Health and Wellness (MOHW), in collaboration with the South East Regional Health Authority and the St. Catherine Health Department, hosted a 'Vax Fest' launch to offer different types of vaccinations to the community members in and around Waterford in Portmore, St. Catherine, on Wednesday, April 24, 2024, at the HEART College of Construction Services. With 'Vax Fest', Jamaica reaffirms its commitment to shore up the availability of vaccination services to communities and to close any gaps that remain across all age groups. The public benefited from free Pap smear tests and vaccines, including pentavalent vaccines, polio vaccines, MMR vaccines, DPT vaccines, and DT vaccines, among others.

Belize, Jamaica and St. Vincent and the Grenadines eliminate mother-to-child transmission of HIV and Syphilis

Belize, Jamaica, and St. Vincent and the Grenadines are the latest countries in the Americas to receive certification from the World Health Organization (WHO) for eliminating the mother-to-child transmission of HIV and syphilis (EMTCT). The milestone was marked on May 7, 2024, at a commemorative event organized by the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) in Kingston, Jamaica, with support from UNICEF and UNAIDS and with the participation of health ministers from the three countries.

In 2010, countries of the Americas committed to the elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV and syphilis endorsed the regional strategy, which was updated in 2016 under the PAHO Plan of Action for the Prevention and Control of HIV and Sexually Transmitted Infections. To meet elimination targets, countries focused on strengthening prevention and treatment services within primary health care and in maternal and child health. This will continue to be done by updating guidelines, ensuring the effective screening of pregnant women, monitoring cases and following-up with HIV and syphilis exposed infants.

In a video message, WHO Director-General Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, praised Belize for integrating primary disease prevention and treatment into maternal and child health services. He also commended Jamaica for its civil society organizations' commitment to human rights and lauded St. Vincent and the Grenadines for investing in robust national laboratory structures.

Dr. the Hon. Christopher Tufton, Minister of Health and Wellness of Jamaica, stated that the elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV and syphilis is a win that underscores protecting the health of all. It is also exemplary of the extraordinary progress being made in our maternal health care. He also said that it is vitally important that we consolidate the gains made from this achievement, especially through continued community engagement and partnership in the public health interest of all.

SERHA Opens Outpatient Waiting Area at the Spanish Town Hospital

The South East Regional Health Authority (SERHA) recently opened the Outpatient Waiting Area at the Spanish Town Hospital (STH), which has the capacity to accommodate 300 patients, who may require care but do not need to be admitted. The covered waiting area is equipped with comfortable chairs to improve patient experience. Funding in the amount of J\$32 million was provided by SERHA.

Speaking at the opening ceremony on Wednesday, May 15, 2024, the Minister of Health and Wellness, Dr. the Hon. Christopher Tufton, said that the upgrade of the facility forms part of the transformation process in the healthcare sector. Addressing the audience, he urged them to protect the new building that was given to them by the Government of Jamaica. He stated that they must use the tools available to them to make things better and to take care of the new space.

He further explained that the implementation of the new patients' electronic health records system used at STH will reduce the waiting time of its patients and increase the capacity of the medical staff to see more patients. He added that he is also pleased with the current upgrades being made to STH including the relocated laboratory and pharmacy. The lab is now equipped with more space, to ensure more tests, with the most modern equipment and highlighted over 100,000 lab tests are done each month. The new National Health Fund Pharmacy is equipped with more space, more drugs dispensing windows and comfortable waiting area and over 12,000 prescriptions are done each month.

In his remarks, Mr. Errol Greene, Regional Director, SERHA, said that the regional team and the key stakeholders have done a tremendous job in the completion of the infrastructural developments of the hospital, including the relocated laboratory and pharmacy, the construction of the main car park, the conversion of the store building into a maintenance staff building, and a daycare centre. The major developments were made to facilitate the redevelopment of the hospital.



Excerpts from the Staff Order for Public Service

7.8 1 STUDY LEAVE

Study Leave is a period of absence granted to public employees to pursue courses of study which may fall into any of the following categories:

Category 1 Government Mandated

Programme of study initiated or mandated by the Government and therefore deemed to be in the national interest. For example government scholarships and awards to fill critical skill shortage area directly related to current functions.

Category 2 Job Related

Programme of study undertaken voluntarily by individual public officers to improve their qualifications and skills in area directly related to current functions.

Category 3 Future Advancement

- (i) Programme of study undertaken voluntarily by individual public officers to improve their qualifications and/or skills for future careers advancement and employability in areas directly related to mandate of the Ministry Department.
- (ii) Programme of study undertaken voluntarily by individual public officers to improve their qualifications and/or skills for future careers advancement and employability in areas not necessarily related to mandate of the Ministry Department by may be applicable for other Ministries/Departments.

Category 4 Personal Interest

Programme of study undertaken voluntarily by individual public officers for personal interest or for growth and development.
